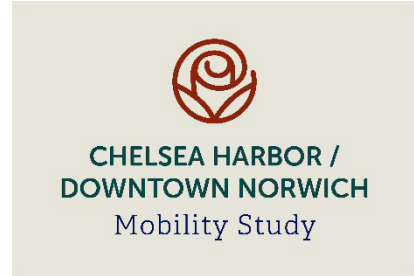

**CHELSEA HARBOR/DOWNTOWN NORWICH MOBILITY STUDY

**Dateline: Norwich, CT May 2024** — The Southeastern Connecticut Council of Governments, in partnership with the City of Norwich and CT Department of Transportation, is announcing the second **public information meeting** for the Chelsea Harbor/Downtown Norwich Mobility Study.

The meeting will take place on Wednesday, June 5<sup>th</sup>, from 5:00-7:00 PM at the Norwich City Hall at 100 Broadway in Room 335. The meeting will provide an opportunity for residents and business owners to learn about proposed transportation and circulation alternatives for downtown, provide input on the preferred alternatives, and allow the public to get in-person answers from the project team.

About the Study: The Study is a key component in the City of Norwich's efforts to provide streets that are safe and accessible for all users, including pedestrians, bicyclists, motorists, and transit users of all ages and abilities. The Study will develop recommendations for modifications to the roadway and sidewalk network that will improve livability, mobility, and access to essential services; and safe routes to the waterfront and Howard T. Brown Park, the Intermodal Transportation Center, the Norwich Marina, and other downtown destinations. These recommendations will be presented in concept plans for downtown circulation that the City can consider for future implementation.
