



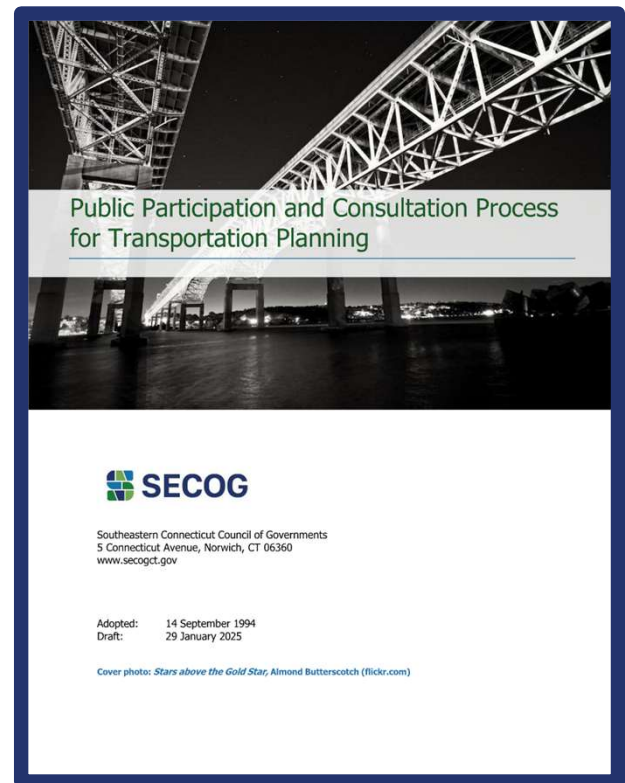

- February 1 – Public Notice, Direct Mailing, Website Posting, Public Comment Period Opens
- **February 19 - Public Hearing**
- March 4 – Executive Committee, referral to COG
- March 17- Public Comment Period Closes
- March 18 - Public comments are incorporated
- March 19 - COG Meeting, anticipated adoption of 2025 updated process
- April 1 – FHWA filing date for updated process

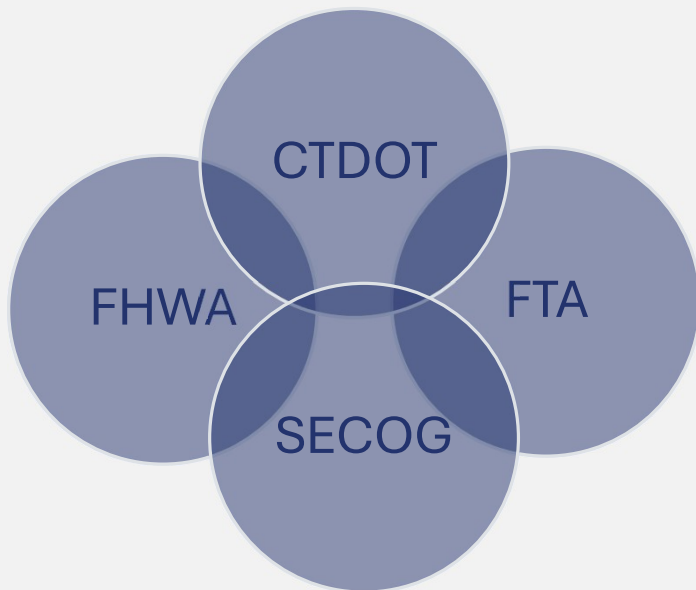

Regulatory Framework



- This process is in conformance with regulation pertaining to Metropolitan Planning Organizations
- Ensures compliance with both FHWA and FTA rules so that we can authorize funding to projects and plan in a manner consistent with the regulatory framework.
- Reference to Code of Federal Regulations 450.316(a)(1)(i) of Title 23 was added
- **EXCEPTION:** Infrequently SECOG will have to use processes not included in this document, including Transit project Environmental Impact Statements, SECOG is required to comply with 23 CFR 771
